## Respondent No. 1 - Draft Regulations on Rules and Procedure for applying for Licences and Permits

The majority of this document I consider to be industry standard, however see the below items.

27. (1) The award of a network licence allowing a person to transmit, or to transmit, distribute and supply electricity shall be decided by the Minister in accordance with this regulation and with the result of the corresponding procurement process.

While I agree that the Minister should have overall responsibility, or to put it another way, "the buck stops with him". It should be seen that the decision to award of licence was reached by a cross section of representative or a Board, and rubber stamped by the Minister. (let's avoid the party-political issue).
